1. Call Meeting to Order

- a. Chairman Kahrl called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

2. Approval of Agenda

a. Secretary Heisterkamp made a motion to approve the agenda as presented. VC Elder seconds the motion. Motion carries unanimously via roll call vote (5/0).

3. Approval of Minutes

a. Secretary Heisterkamp requested the following correction to the 2/21/2024 minutes, 9. Board Committee Reports, 1. 2nd bullet, ..." will call Placer County" VC Elder made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. Director Burns seconds the motion. Motion carries unanimously via roll call vote (5/0).

 - PG&E will not re-schedule the transformer work until Caltrans extends their permit for the work to commence. PG&E is working on this.
 - Director Bettencourt verified with DM Armstrong that no check has been received from the county to reimburse the landscape deposit.

10. Informational/Non-Action Items

- a. Board to review LAFCO letter regarding Joint Operations Agreement and Agreement for Administrative Services.
 - i. Chief Gow reviewed the letter received from LAFCO dated February 28, 2024.
 - ii. The Placer Hills attorney has been consulted and requested to write a response.
- b. Board to discuss NFPD's parcel ownership at the Chantry Hill Ballpark.
 - i. Secretary Heisterkamp reviewed the data from the title search. The fire district owns the two small parcels; however, the "Village of Newcastle" owns the largest parcel. The board will need to further consider and take action to determine how the continued use of the field will be administered, specifically, the requirement for the Little League to provide insurance documentation indemnifying the district from year to year.

If this happens, that will brig the percentage of the annual budget expended on salaries to 88%. Anything above 85% is worrisome.
 - i. Secretary Heisterkamp stated that it will be tight and that he will need to run the numbers.
- b. Secretary Heisterkamp reported that the plaque recognizing retired DM Lofrano has arrived. Requested that Chairman Kahrl write a letter to Gill letting her know.
- c. Director Burns reported on his being appointed to the Greater Auburn Fire Safe Council.

- b. Consider and approve the Audit for Fiscal Year 2022/2023 prepared by Smith & Newell CPAs
 - i. Secretary Heisterkamp reported that the report is thorough and they made adjustments and recommendations. Reviewed the action plans for the deficiencies with District Manager Armstrong and agree with the responses.
 - ii. Secretary Heisterkamp made a motion to approve the 2022/2023 audit in all of its forms. VC Elder seconds the motion. Motion carries unanimously via roll call vote (4/0).
